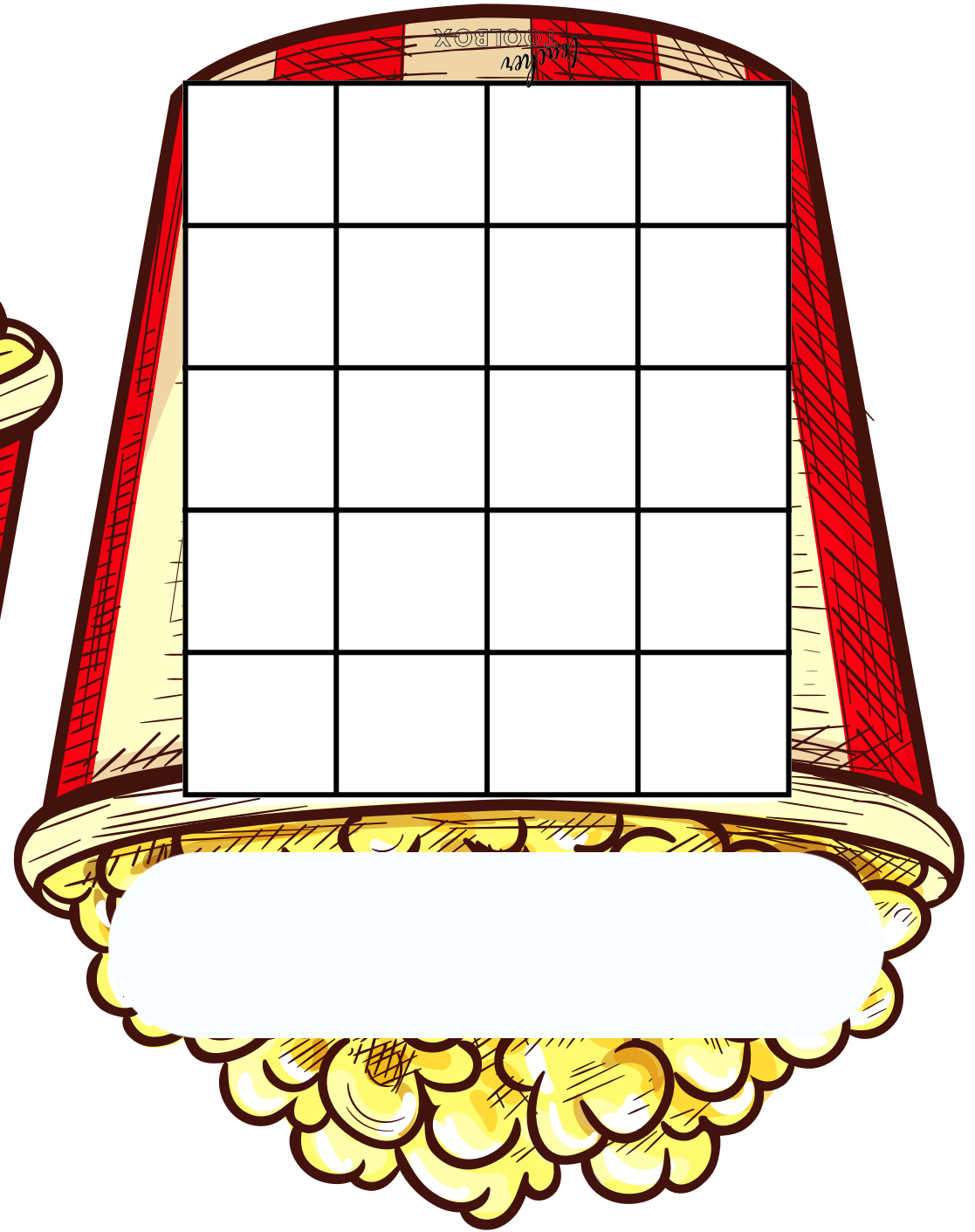
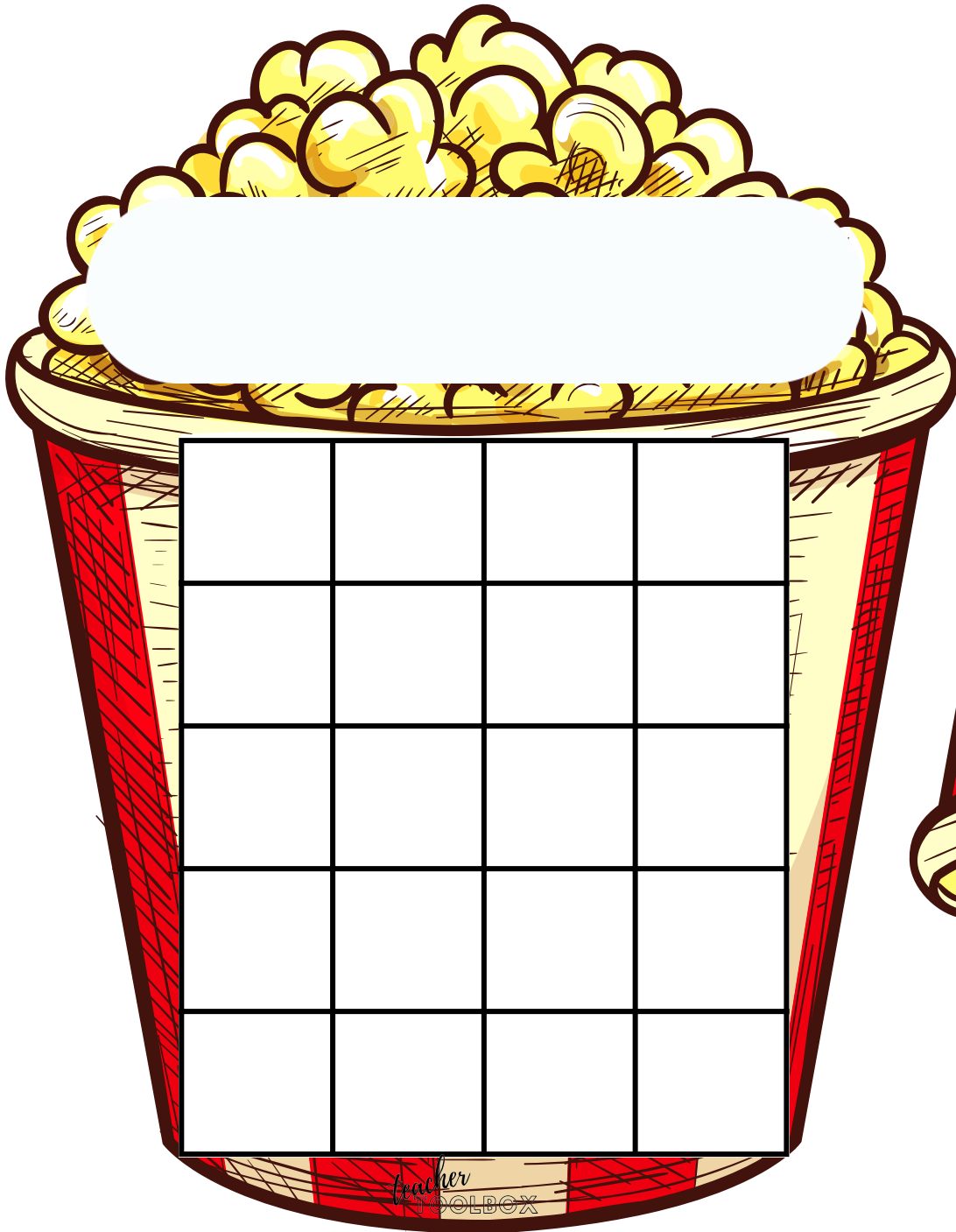

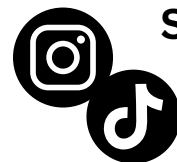

Recommended use:

At Teacher Toolbox, we understand keeping track of a whole class of children's reading, both at school and at home, is hard! It can also be difficult to encourage children to take ownership of their learning, by getting them to read and record their reading at home. The aim of this resource is to celebrate their efforts when they do read at home. We suggest you laminate a popcorn per child, then display these in the classroom, in a folder, or in their reading records. Once a day, make it a child's job to check through the reading records, or similar, and using a whiteboard pen, give children who read a tick. If they fill their popcorn, they receive a certificate or prize and then their ticks are rubbed out and you start all over again. Alternatively, don't laminate them, and print a fresh one each time they complete it, so they can collect their popcorn pots and take them home!



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
